CRCID follows the DAC List of ODA Recipients that shows all countries and territories eligible to receive official development assistance (ODA). These consist of all low and middle income countries, except G8 members, EU members, and countries with a firm date for entry into the EU.

Americas: Bolivia - Caribbean Regional Program* - Colombia - Haiti - Honduras - Peru

Asia: Afghanistan - Bangladesh - Indonesia - Pakistan - Vietnam

Eastern Europe: Ukraine

North Africa and Middle East: West Bank and Gaza**

Sub-Saharan Africa: Ethiopia - Ghana - Mali - Mozambique - Senegal- Sudan - Tanzania
